The 23 years old, The Panipat-born is an Indian Track and field athlete who completes in the javelin throw. A Junior Commissioned Officer in the Indian Army, is the first track and field athlete to win a **GOLD MEDAL** for India at the **OLYMPICS GAMES TOKYO 2020**.

Saikhom Mirabai Chanu won the **SILVER MEDAL** at the **TOKYO OLYMPICS 2020** in Women's 49 kg category. She was awarded the Padma Shri by the Government of India for her contributions to the sport.

Ravi Kumar Dahiya is an Indian freestyle wrestler who won a **SILVER MEDAL** at the **2020 TOKYO OLYMPICS** in the 57 kg category. He is also a bronze medalist from 2019 World Wrestling Championships and a two-time Asian champion.

Pusarla Venkata Sindhu is the first Indian to become the Badminton World Champion and only the second individual athlete from India to win two consecutive medals at the Olympic Games. She won **BRONZE MEDAL** in **TOKYO OLYMPICS 2020**. She was awarded Major Dhyani Chand Khel Ratna, the Padma Shri and Padma Bhushan.

She won a **BRONZE MEDAL** at the **2020 TOKYO OLYMPICS** in the Women's welterweight event, becoming only the third Indian boxer to win a medal at the Olympics. In 2020, she became the sixth person from Assam to receive Arjuna Award.

Sumit Antil is an Indian paralympian and javelin thrower. He won a gold medal in men's javelin throw F64 category at the 2020 Summer Paralympics. He holds the current world record, having thrown 68.55 metres in the Paralympic final.

Pramod Bhagat is an Indian professional Para-badminton player from Vaishali district, Bihar. He is currently ranked world number one in para-badminton men's singles SL3, and won a gold medal at the 2020 Summer Paralympics in Men's singles SL3

Manish Narwal is an Indian Para Pistol Shooter. He ranks fourth in the world in Men's 10m Air Pistol SH1 according to the World Shooting Para Sport Rankings. Manish is also supported by GoSports Foundation through the Para Champions Programme. He won a gold medal for India in Mixed P4 – 50 m pistol SH1 at 2020 Summer Paralympics.

Yogesh Kathuniya is an Indian Paralympic athlete who specializes in the discus throw. He represented India at 2020 Summer Paralympics, where he won silver medal in men's discus throw F56 event.

Nishad Kumar is an Indian paralympian and high jumper. He made his maiden Paralympic Games appearance in 2020 Tokyo representing India and went onto claim silver medal in the men's high jump T47 category with a new Asian record of 2.06m.

Mariyappan Thangavelu is an Indian Paralympic high jumper. He won silver medal at 2020 Summer Paralympic games held in Tokyo in the men's high jump T-63 category He is India's first Paralympian gold medalist since 2004.

Praveen, who hails from a village near Jewar in Gautam Buddha Nagar district and is a B.A. second year student in Motilal Nehru College in Delhi, not only registered his personal best performance, but also became the youngest medal winner in the Indian contingent in Tokyo. He won silver medal in the Men's high jump T64 event at the 2020 Summer Paralympics.

Devendra Jhajharia is an Indian Paralympic javelin thrower competing in F46 events. He is the first Indian Paralympics player to win two gold medals at the Paralympics.

Harvinder Singh is an Indian paralympic archer. He won bronze medal in the men's singles recurve archery at the 2020 Summer Paralympics. It is the first ever Paralympic medal in archery for India.

Sharad Kumar is an Indian para high jumper and a former world no. 1. Born in Muzaffarpur, he made his International debut at the 2010 Asian Para Games. He won a bronze medal in the men's high jump T42 at 2020 Summer Paralympics.

Sundar Singh Gurjar is an Indian Paralympic javelin thrower, shot putter and discus thrower competing in F46 events. He won bronze medal at Tokyo 2020 Paralympics in men's javelin F46 event.

Manoj Sarkar is the current World no.1 Para-badminton player in the SL-3 Classification. He has won a silver medal in the BWF Para-Badminton World championships, 2017 in the singles event. He won bronze medal at Tokyo 2020 Paralympics.

Jehan Daruvala, the young Indian F2 driver carrying a billion hopes



Jehan Daruvala is a 22 year old Formula 2 racer from the city of Mumbai. Jehan signed for Fortec Motorsport in the Formula Renault Championship 2.0 as a 17 year old in 2015. He ended fifth in the Northern European Cup and participated as a guest driver in the European and Alps edition.

The youngster recently made the news after his win at Monza in Formula 2 Sprint Race 2. He became the first Indian to win a F2 race, during the Shakir Grand Prix. This was just days after he earned his maiden podium finish, when he finished third in a support race during the Bahrain Grand Prix. Born in a Parsi family to Khurshed and

Kainaz Daruvala on 1st October 1998, Jehan spent his childhood days studying at the Bombay Scottish School. He started karting at an early age of 13 under the eyes of Rayomand Banerjee and soon started dominating the Asian and European circuits.

Jehan Daruvala is a name which has been wandering around in each and every Indian newspaper and media portal in the last few weeks. Such has been his performance that the youngster has now turned into a household name in sport loving families. But, who really is Jehan Daruvala? Jehan is a 22 year old Formula 2 racer from the city of Mumbai. A protégé of the Force India F1 team, Jehan Daruvala, who is part of the Red Bull Junior Team, is currently competing for British side Carlin in the FIA Formula 2 Championship. He opens up on his F1 dreams, equation with former teammate and F1 driver Yuki Tsunoda, association with Carlin, the Red Bull programme



The following year, he signed for Josef Kauffman Racing and showcased much improved performance than the previous season, earning his first pole finish in the Northern European Cup and ended the fourth overall.

2016 also saw the beginning of Jehan's initiation into the European Formula 3 circuit. He was signed by Carlin Motorsports in December 2016 for the 2017 season. He won one race in 2017 and finished sixth overall whilst



also outscoring all of his teammates at Carlin except for Lando Norris who was crowned the champion. The time period which followed saw Jehan plying his trade for M2 Competition, MP Motorsport and Prema Racing. He competed in the inaugural F3 season for Prema Racing in 2019. The 2019 season saw him finishing third overall with 2 race wins and a total of seven podium finishes. After a fantastic run in 2019, Jehan reunited with Carlin Motorsports in early 2020 to race for the Red Bull Junior Team in FIA Formula 2. In a total of 24 races he took part this season, the Indian youngster finished one win and one more podium finish to end the season with 72 points at 12th position overall.

The rise to the top has been rapid for Jehan. He would surely be hoping and working towards breaking into the Formula 1 circuit soon. With the talent he possesses and the performance he has showcased, Jehan Daruvala is surely the one to watch out for.
